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Remembering 'Uncle Joe'

Slain officer had big influence on Chaska sergeant

As a young boy growing up in Maplewood, the sight of a police car excited Mike Duzan like nothing else could. At a time when most kids would be wary of an approaching officer, Duzan couldn't wait to see who was wearing the badge inside. "I'd see the squad car pull up and I'd look to see if it was Uncle Joe," he said. Sgt. Joe Bergeron was Duzan's

hero and the reason he later became a police officer himself. Bergeron, a 26-year-veteran of the Maplewood Police Department, was fatally shot last Saturday as he attempted to confront a pair of alleged carjackers. He was 49 years old. Sgt. Duzan, who has served as a Chaska police officer for 15 years, said police work was just a small part of who his uncle was. "He comes from a large family," said Duzan. "When we would get together, you'd look for pile of kids and find him. Everyone gravitated toward him." Everyone, including Duzan. "I looked up to him," he said. "I was extremely proud of my uncle." When Duzan was in high school,

Bergeron let him ride along with him several times he patrolled the streets of Maplewood. "I was about 16 or 17," Duzan recalled. "I was hooked. "There I was sitting next to my

hero, watching him help people," he continued. "I would have spent 24 hours in that car with him, even if there was nothing to do." After graduating from high school, Duzan mulled over the opportunities ahead of him, including a scholarship to Alaska. "I didn't really want to be in Alaska," Duzan realized. Instead, he wanted to become a police officer like his Uncle Joe. He broke the news of his decision to his uncle who responded by saying, "Aw Mikey - he never called me Michael, always Mikey," Duzan recalled. "You're young and full of energy. You probably think you can change the world." Bergeron was right. With his uncle as a shining example, Duzan "knew every single day he could change

Kohls turns page on legislative career

GOP rep won't seek fifth term

State Rep. Paul Kohls, a Victoria Republican representing District 34A, will not be seeking a fifth term in the Minnesota House of Representatives, he announced Monday. Citing a new job that would not accommodate legislative involvement past this session, Kohls said his decision was "bittersweet" but, in the long run, inevitable. "I never intended to serve forever," he said. "Now I'm closing the pages of this chapter of my life and getting ready for the next one. I'm ready for this." Kohls said he made the

decision a year ago to seek re-election, but he has been seeking full-time employment since wrapping up his short-lived campaign for governor in late October. Along with his decision to seek re-election, he kept in mind that he wouldn't dismiss good employment if it meant having to choose between politics and a steady job. "I knew my legislative career could end in the relatively near future," he said, "but I was excited to run for re-election." During his time in the House, Kohls, 36, worked as an attorney at both a major law firm and as a senior manager for Allianz Life Insurance in Golden Valley.

Seeking the party's gubernatorial nomination, Kohls took a leave of absence from Allianz. For the past few months he has been performing contract work for the company, he said.

Chaska man pleads guilty to child pornography possession

A 46-year-old Chaska man has pleaded guilty to possessing more than 600 images of child pornography.

According to a press release from U.S. Attorney B. Todd Jones, Fredric John Pishney pleaded guilty to one count of possession of child pornography before U.S. District Court Judge Donovan W. Frank in federal court in St. Paul on Tuesday.

According to the release, in

his plea agreement, Pishney admitted that on Jan. 9, 2008, he possessed the pornographic images, which he obtained from the Internet. The images were found on Pishney's computer hard drives, removable media and compact discs when police executed a search warrant at his Chaska residence.

The case against Pishney arose from an investigation conducted by Europol, a multi-jurisdictional law enforcement

organization in Europe. At the time, the organization was investigating an international child pornography ring. When information was uncovered relative to Pishney, Europol referred it to U.S. authorities for further action, the release stated.

Pishney faces a potential maximum penalty of ten years in prison. Judge Frank will impose his sentence at a hearing not yet scheduled.

Ace Hardware opening mid-July in downtown

Downtown is set to have a hardware store once again. "We wanted to share some good news," said Bruce Lundgren, property manager and partner in the Chaska Brickyard Shopping Center. Lundgren reports that Security Development Company signed a lease with Arrow Ace Hardware last week. They will take over the space formerly occupied by Snyder's Drug Store to the east of Cooper's County Market. Lundgren said that Arrow Ace Hardware is a chain of 11 hardware stores based in St. Peter. "The closest one is in Shakopee," he noted. Arrow Ace Hardware is

looking opening mid-July in the 11,000 square foot space. Lundgren said that the shopping center's façade will be remodeled over the next six weeks. All but the Cooper's County Market space will be done. Cooper's will eventually get its own remodel. "Construction starts Thursday," said Lundgren. Chaska currently has one mega-hardware store, Home Depot, in Chaska Commons. The city's last downtown hardware store, Chaska Building Center off of Highway 212, closed in May 2008. Recently announced redevelopment plans for the now dormant 12-acre site called for a 10,000-square-foot hardware store.

Street assessments lower than expected

North Meadows residents got a bit of good news about the street reconstruction slated for their neighborhood this summer. Bids came in even lower than the city of Chaska expected, reducing homeowners' assessments by about \$500. Monday night the Chaska City Council adopted the assessment roll for the \$1.3 million project. Affected residents in 71 homes will pay 25 percent of the project costs, or a maximum of \$4,350 each. The city will pick up the remaining 75 percent, per Chaska policy. Chaska City Engineer Bill Monk was pleased with the bids the city received back on the project, indicating that they represented an 11 to 12 percent decrease from what they were

expecting. Councilor Rick Ford expressed both his pleasure and envy over the assessments, noting that his neighborhood underwent a similar street reconstruction project a few years ago and their bill was several thousand dollars higher. "You guys got a much better deal," he said. Street reconstruction will kick off in mid-June and should last through September, Monk said. Assessments will be levied against affected homeowners in November. Residents will then have 30 days to pay in full. Otherwise annual payments will be made over the next 10 years when property taxes are due. "They'll pay \$435 in principal every year," said Monk. "It's a very straightforward setup."

If all goes as planned, hundreds of volunteers will descend on six locations across Chaska to paint, repair and landscape. This year's event marks the 14th anniversary of the program which assists homeowners who don't have the physical or financial means to rehabilitate their own residences.

Last year, more than 250 volunteers helped spruce up places around town. This year, so far 75 have committed via phone.

"That's a little low," said longtime organizer Mary Monteith. "Usually we're over 100 by this time."

Monteith isn't especially worried, though. They usually have plenty of people show up day of to help out.

"It's cool to see how many repeaters we get," she said.

This year's projects include one mobile home in Riverview, two homes in downtown Chaska and two homes in Jonathan. Also on the docket is the Au-

burn Manor courtyard. That project is ideal for younger volunteers, Monteith said.

"It's been tough to match younger volunteers to appropriate work sites," she explained. "So we're trying to switch gears. We tried to think outside the box this year."

Tasking younger volunteers with helping fix up the Auburn Manor courtyard seemed like a perfect solution.

"It's a great fit for the younger set," she said.

Other projects volunteers will be tackling this year include siding, lawn cleanup, staining and screen repair. Monteith said they are still looking for skilled volunteers in plumbing and screen repair.

So far, the weather forecast was looking good for Saturday - cloudy and cool with no rain. If it should rain, the event will be held Sunday.

"We have been so lucky in years past," said Monteith. "I'm confident it will happen on Saturday."

Until then, Monteith is try-

ing not to let nerves get the best of her.

"I tend to be uneasy the day of," she confessed. "But then the hours pass and I think 'Wow, we pulled it off again.'"

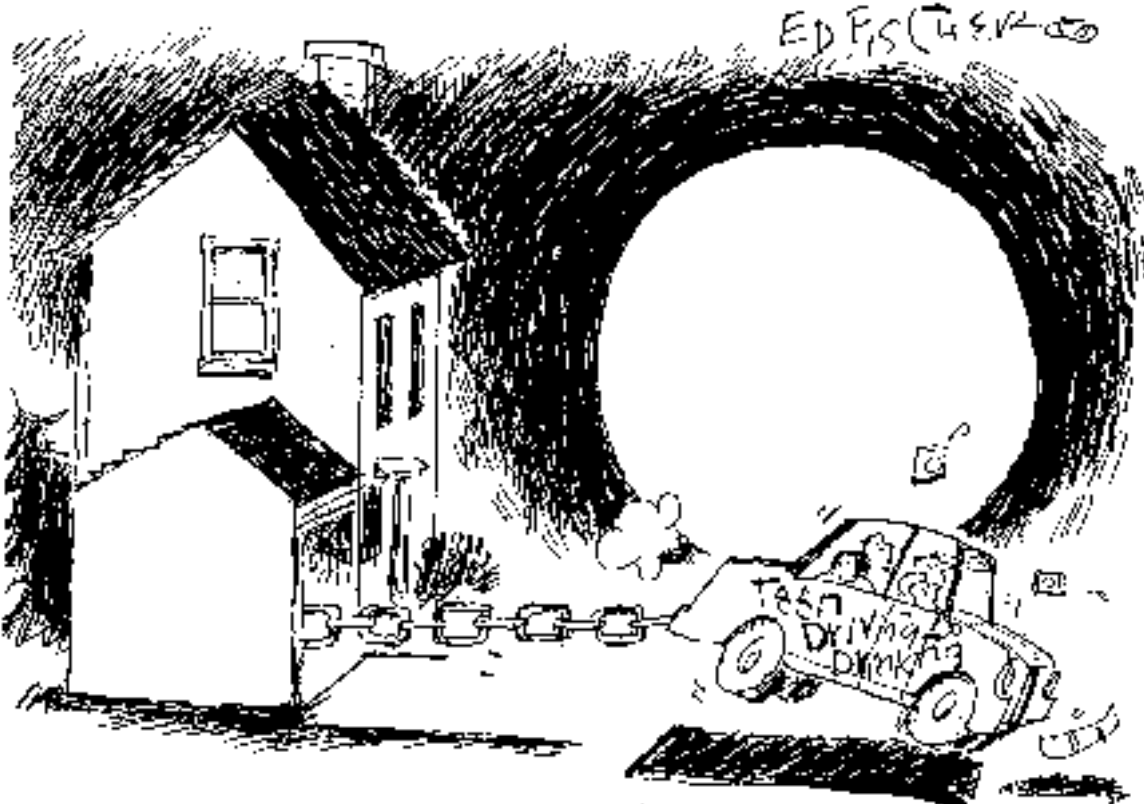
to feel the "power."

Split high schools in two, by grade

It's a nice rainy, Friday afternoon in Chaska. I like the rain. It's calming. It brings to life the spring season.

At one point in my life I dreaded rain. That was in college, where the house I lived in had a leaky roof, and the rain would work its way into the wiring of the house, and down the ceiling light in the kitchen. That light had its switch on the light itself, and tended to stay on during a rain. No one wanted to touch it, lest they be shocked.

There was a suicide in Chaska a few days back. A freshman at Chaska High. No one foresaw any problems or concerns with this child, except for one group. That group foresaw the problem when they cited research that freshmen are an at-risk group of students.

That group pushed for a separate Freshman Center, so that these real problems could be addressed, solutions found, and parents and friends and family spared a lifetime of suffering.

That group is gone now, replaced with a different group that cites cost savings and efficiencies in combining at-risk freshmen with students three or four years older. That group pushed not for a new middle school, so as to keep the Freshman Center open, but another high school that operates at 60 percent occupancy.

That group has no interest in doing the smart and right thing: changing Chaska High into a ninth- and tenth-grade school and Chanhassen High into the eleventh- and twelfth-grade school.

In this situation, the risky transition will only include one grade difference. Friendships that began

in middle school will be allowed to flourish for four more years, instead of extinguished after three. No more open enrollment quotas, and plenty of students to fill thinly enrolled alternative classes and sports.

Best of all, it works. White Bear Lake High School has just this arrangement.

Let's talk to the District 112 school board about this, before anybody else gets shocked by news of another freshman tragedy.

Recently, I just wrapped up a job fair – not that I was looking for a job. Quite the contrary, as I'm very pleased to be where I am today. This time I was organizing a job fair.

I was the program manager/team lead for the Project Management Institute (Minnesota Chapter) 2010 Job Fair.

Last year was the first time our chapter held a job fair, spurred by the rising unemployment rates and need to help those our organization represents – project management professionals. As a volunteer, I helped to recruit companies to participate in the event. After the success of last year's event, I was asked to lead this year's event.

Our goal was to grow the event and help more people than we were able to in 2009. So, this year, a fantastic team of 25 grew the event from 15 to 26 participating companies, and attendance increased by an estimated 50 percent. With a little luck, many of people will land rewarding new jobs and others may get back on their feet again. And companies will fill needed positions that will help them grow and flourish as the economy recovers.

For me, this was a great example of what volunteerism is all about.

Many moons ago, I worked for a consulting firm who had three fundamental tests for making decisions:

1. Is it good for the client?
2. Is it good for the company (us)?
3. Is it the right thing to do?
4. (Decision point) Just do it!

The benchmark used is pretty sound, even when looking at volunteerism.

Is it good for the client? In this case, it is good for the people we're charged with helping? Obviously, the whole point of volunteerism is to help others, so this is a no-brainer.

Helping others learn to fish, and giving them the tools is ultimately beneficial to everyone, including the greater community. There is tremendous value in all forms of volunteerism, but to me, those which are most powerful and impactful are ones which allow those being helped to re-engage as contributing members of the community, and eventually give back.

Is it good for us? This is probably where people get tripped up the most. Fundamentally, I'd like to believe that we have all it in our hearts to help others – the kind spirit of human nature. But in today's complex world, we're often pulled by conflicting priorities – work, family, and multiple other obligations.

Finding time to volunteer is always

a challenge. Volunteerism doesn't mean that you have to spend 10 hours a week or even five. Giving even a little bit of time here or there, a few times a year, can make a huge difference.

Is it the right thing to do? Whether it's baking something for the church bake sale or doing some painting for Christmas in May, every little bit makes a difference. Lives are affected for the better. In a way, part of the selfish part of "the right thing" is that we get something out of giving – we feel good about helping others. We have the instant gratification of receiving the smile of someone who has had their day brightened by a positive ray of light in what could be a dim point in their own lives.

How often can most of us touch someone else's life so profoundly?

In addition, helping people directly through volunteering, gives us the opportunity to ground ourselves and appreciate what we have and not take things for granted. These days, it's often easy to complain about how we didn't get a raise or our salary/hours were cut, or maybe how healthcare costs five times more than it did a decade ago.

Knowing that we helped our friends and neighbors builds closer ties. And knowing that they would return the favor helps to solidify our own weave into our community's fabric.

Christmas in May is around the corner, and there are plenty volunteer opportunities with church, community and civic groups. Professional organizations, shelters, and environmental groups all have needs for volunteers – even in small ways.

We all understand time is limited, and each of us can only do so much. We focus our energies on causes and organizations that are important to us. We don't need to tackle the world, but even helping with the smallest tasks can make a huge impact.

So, get going and sign up! Christmas in May is this weekend. But if that's not your cup of tea, there are lots of volunteer opportunities available in and around Chaska. Find a cause that's close to your heart, and go with it.

Who manages our lakes and rivers?

Carver County has 37 lakes and five creeks enjoyed by wildlife, visitors and many citizens. But who manages these water bodies? The answer is the Carver County Water Management Organization (CCWMO).

The purpose of the CCWMO is to fulfill the county's water management responsibilities under Minnesota statute and rule. CCWMO boundaries include six watershed districts: Pioneer-Sarah Creek, Bevens Creek, Carver Creek, East Chaska Creek, West Chaska Creek, and the South Fork of the Crow River.

So how does the CCWMO make decisions about the many water bodies within its boundaries? The CCWMO is governed by its Water Management Plan (WMP). First written in 2001, the plan is currently undergoing revisions

and updates. The WMP is intended to be a 10-year planning document to guide CCWMO activities.

The plan contains detailed information regarding land and water resources within the county, 11 chapters on major issues; a chapter on implementation; and a chapter on administration.

The major issue chapters include Surface Water Management, Impaired Waters, Urban Stormwater Management, Wetland Management, Agricultural Practices, Sanitary Sewer Discharge, Upland Natural Resources, Groundwater Management, Soil & Hazardous Waste, Education and Monitoring and Assessment.

It's through this plan that the CCWMO designs its water monitoring program, creates incentive programs for homeowners, begins studies of impaired waters and how to improve them, decides wetland setbacks, and lays out an education plan for citizens, students, staff and local decision makers. Each major issues chapter lays

out goals and policies.

The plan is currently undergoing revisions and updates. The County Board recently released the draft plan for public comment and the county is currently gathering input from citizens on the plan.

Already endorsed

Kohls' announcement came as a shock to Frank Long, chair of the Carver County Republican Party. Serving District 34A, which includes parts of Carver and Scott counties, since 2002, Kohls has been a shoo-in for the Republicans during the last two elections.

In 2008, Kohls beat DFLer

Marcia Krueger 67 percent to 32 percent. In 2006, he beat her 66 percent to 34 percent. "I hate to lose him," said Long. "He's a hard worker, honest, earnest, well thought of."

In April of this year Kohls was endorsed to run for re-election.

"This recent development in the race is definitely a positive

one for my campaign," said DFL candidate Leanne Kunze, of Laketown Township, in a statement. "Challenging an incumbent is a difficult task, but a task we were prepared to take on."

seats. Now they'll add the House District 34A seat to that agenda, Long said.

Kohls is the 17th state legislator planning not to seek re-election this year.

Hobbits and vampires

Student book club gathers range of characters

When it comes to the range of literary tastes of middle school students, books such as "The Hobbit" and "Twilight" are generally at extreme opposite ends.

"If you love one, you're probably going to hate the other," said eighth-grade student Jonathan Murphy. "My brother just about fell over when he saw I was reading 'Twilight.'"

Murphy is just one of the members of the Pioneer Ridge Middle School eighth-grade book club, which brings together those students who simply share a love of reading.

About 15 consistent participants gather in the school's Media Center during their lunch period each Monday, to discuss and argue over the characters, plots and author motivations in books like H.G. Wells' "The Time Machine" and titles from the Sherlock Holmes series.

The school's Language Arts teachers have started book clubs for the sixth- and seventh-grade students, but not eighth-grade.

"Most of us were hanging out in the library in the morning before class starts, so we thought we should start our own club," said Claire Katchur.

"We're all friends and we love to read, so it just made sense."

Hobbits or vampires

While most of the books are easily agreed upon, getting everyone to read "The Hobbit" and "Twilight" took a little convincing.

"I don't know how anyone could like 'The Hobbit,' because it's so boring," said Sara Morton. "It's just about this small creature walking, walking, then wishing he was home, walking again, losing his friends, finding his friends and then finally walking some more."

Kyle Donovan said he didn't enjoy "Twilight."

"I could probably rip out half the book and still understand the story," he said. "It's just a girl going on and on about how much she loves this guy."

But the reasons for their likes or dislikes run deeper than simple gender splits.

"I thought 'The Hobbit' was way too descriptive," said Meaghan Walker. "The author used two sentences to describe a scenario that would have taken me about five words."

"Which is exactly what I like about the book," countered Brad Weber.

Walker was one of the few girls that didn't really like "Twilight" either, however.

"That book seems to be written by a second-grader who used a thesaurus to find some really big words," she said.

The students do recognize the benefits of reading such drastically different books.

"I like stepping out of my comfort zone a bit, because it makes you analyze the book in a way you probably would never do otherwise," said Morton.

One significant factor behind the clubs inception, however, is the ability for the students to hang out with other kids who enjoy a similar activity.

"We go our separate ways throughout the week, but then meet every Monday to talk about our books and just things going on in general," said Katchur. "It's a real pick-me-up, because Monday's can be a bummer until I realize it is book club day."

The students even organized an overnight lock-in at the school for all the student book clubs. Media Specialist Jeanne LaMoore and parents volunteered as chaperones as the kids went to watch a movie and then returned to the school for a night of their favorite reads.

"It's nice to be with friends and discuss a book with those who really enjoy reading," said Katchur.

somebody's world."
 "He left an impression on everyone he had contact with," said Duzan of his uncle. "He treated people with dignity."
 When Duzan finally became a police officer, his uncle beamed with pride. "He told me I was going to be a good cop," said Duzan, his voice wavering at the memory.
 "He's my measuring stick," Duzan continued. "I knew I'd be a successful cop the day I was like Uncle Joe."
 "I can attest that Joe was proud of his nephew at the Chaska Police Department," wrote Maplewood Police Deputy Chief Dave Kvam in an e-mail. "He spoke of him often."

Worst fears

Duzan learned about his uncle's shooting while at work last Saturday. Around 7 a.m. he caught chatter on the scanner. "Something was going on," he said. "They were gearing up for something bad."

As a previous St. Paul police officer, Duzan worried about his former co-workers. "I had a big fear that one of my friends had been hurt in St. Paul," he recalled.
 But it wasn't long before he heard that a Maplewood officer had been shot.
 "I had a sinking feeling," he said. "A little while later my worst fears were realized." Bergeron had been shot and killed.
 Duzan is devastated by the death of his uncle.
 "There was no secret that it was a dangerous job," he said. "He wasn't even supposed to be at work that day," Duzan added. "He was going to retire in January."
 "This is the kind of tragedy that comes with the job and can happen anywhere," said Chaska

Police Chief Scott Knight. "Officers have to come to work every day knowing that they could find themselves in a violent encounter. They have to be prepared."
 Knight said that an incident like this does "shake everyone's world" but also brings a police department closer to one another.
 "We come together as a strong family," he said.
 "Officers are reminded in this job we place a high level of importance on serving other people and the sanctity of human life," Knight added.

Memory

Duzan said that even though his uncle is gone, he will continue to soldier on as a police officer.
 "Everyone has it once in awhile where they question their job," he said. "But somebody's gotta show up when people need help. I love helping."
 Duzan will keep asking himself "How would Uncle Joe handle this?" when confronted with various situations at work. He will take with him the lessons his uncle taught him about how to effectively do his job, including treating people right.
 "When I show up, I want people to feel better," said Duzan.
 And he will keep his uncle's memory alive whether it's thinking back to his first ride-along, recalling their time spent serving together on the Maplewood Fire Department or reminiscing about their carp fishing expeditions.
 "He loved life and everybody loved him," said Duzan. "He was a great father, a great family man and a great cop."
 Most of all, Duzan will remember how watching a man do his job well, influenced his own career and life.
 "I'm a cop today because of Uncle Joe," he said. "One hundred percent."

"School is just getting in the way of everything else these kids do, and Mary really cares about the students and is great at finding ways to make school fun," she said.
 Sixth-grade student Elliott Stark said school is definitely more fun with Mrs. Perrine.
 "Her classes are enjoyable because we're not just sitting in our chairs the whole time," he said. "And all her crazy stories are hilarious."
 Perrine, who has been instrumental in setting up popular activities like the district's middle school Immigration Day and a Battle Day that correlates

with their Civil War unit, said she can't teach math straight from the book, page by page.

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Speaking to protect, prevent, and remember

Her face was intense as her eyes recalled a room full of 6-foot-long tables with skulls on them.

Machete marks were still in the skulls, and Dr. Ellen Kennedy said she began to sob.

"I was overcome by what I saw," her eyes focused on the present. "There was a horrific loss of life."

The interim director at the University of Minnesota Center for Holocaust and Genocide Studies will be at the Chanhassen Library this Saturday speaking about international peace building and conflict resolution as part of the library's Great Decisions series.

Rwanda

In 2005, Kennedy traveled to Rwanda, Africa. A professor, now retired, she had been teaching and speaking about the Rwandan Genocide of 1994 since it happened. Experiencing its effects first-hand brought the harsh reality into her life in a whole different way.

"In Rwanda I met a woman named Alice," she said. "Alice is an orphan survivor of that genocide. One day in 1994 her mother asked her to go to the next village on an errand to her cousin's house. When Alice returned home, she was the one to discover the bodies of her grandparents, her mother and her father, her 12-year-old sister, and her 9-year-old and 2-year-old

brothers. She became an orphan as a consequence of that genocide, like literally hundreds of thousands of other children."

In that hut full of unidentified skulls, down a dirt path in the jungle, Kennedy's heart was torn. She said, Alice told her, "You don't need to see this. This isn't your problem. It's our problem."

The statement was an indictment of the world's response to genocide, she said. It seared into Kennedy's conscience. She returned to continue teaching at St. Thomas University, but on the topic of the Rwandan Genocide she had a renewed sense of obligation and personal responsibility to increase awareness about what had happened.

World Without Genocide

In 2005 she founded a not-for-profit organization called World Without Genocide (<http://worldwithoutgenocide.org/>). The intention is to protect innocent people, prevent genocides from happening, prosecute the perpetrators, and remember the victims.

In 2009 Kennedy was the recipient of the Anne Frank "Outstanding Citizen" Award. "Genocide is a global problem. It's our problem," she said. "We believe that knowledge plus action equals power."

Now retired from the classroom, she herself is like a mobile classroom. She concentrates on educating people

about the crises that go on in the world and about steps they can take to make a difference.

"Ordinary citizens can do a great deal," she said. "Former President Clinton was president in 1994 during the Rwandan genocide. He said that he could have saved probably a few hundred thousand lives, but he did nothing because he heard nothing from senators or representatives urging him to take action."

The reason elected officials failed to take action was because ordinary citizens failed to take action, she said.

"We encourage ordinary citizens to contact their representatives. We encourage people to call 1-800-Genocide (436-6243). All you need to know is your zip code, and you will automatically be routed to your representative or senator," she said.

The charge now for World Without Genocide is to alert people to contact their elected officials about applying pressure to stop the ongoing conflict between Africans and Arabs in Darfur, Sudan. The United Nations puts the death toll in Sudan at roughly 300,000.

You have to get up pretty early in the morning to pull the wool over the eyes of this Knowledge Bowl team.

Recently, the whip-smart Holy Family Catholic High School Knowledge Bowl team that won the 2010 Metro Region Championship, and took fourth at the Minnesota State Knowledge Bowl, gathered in a classroom to talk about the thrill of finishing ahead of the perennial champion team from Chaska High School. HFCHS' team competes in Region 11 as does Chanhassen and Chaska high schools.

The state tournament was in April, in Brainerd.

Taking first place in Class AA was St. Anthony Village followed by Little Falls, St. Thomas Academy, Holy Family, and then Chaska.

Holy Family's team is six years old and was launched by Tom Walker, a social studies teacher at HFCHS and Knowledge Bowl coach. Tryouts for the team are in the fall; applicants take a written exam and the top 15 students make the team.

From there, students form three 5-person teams; each member becomes a specialist in a subject: English, math, science, and history, and is led by a team captain whose job is to pull the information together. The three teams practice by competing against each other.

It helps to be smart and well-read but Walker and the students study from digests they've assembled in each competitive area of knowledge.

Knowledge Bowl meets with in each region consist of teams first answering a questionnaire of 60 questions; the three teams scoring the highest points continue in the live question-and-answer phase. During the competition season, teams start to see a pattern in the questions.

"This year it seemed like the questions tended toward being about plate tectonics," Stan Rojina, a senior from Chanhassen said. "You can tell from the first rounds, the pattern of the subjects, so then you go back and study that topic more."

Still, sports teams are constantly drilled on fundamentals of their sport; what are the fundamentals, so to speak, that every self-respecting Knowledge Bowl competitor should have down?

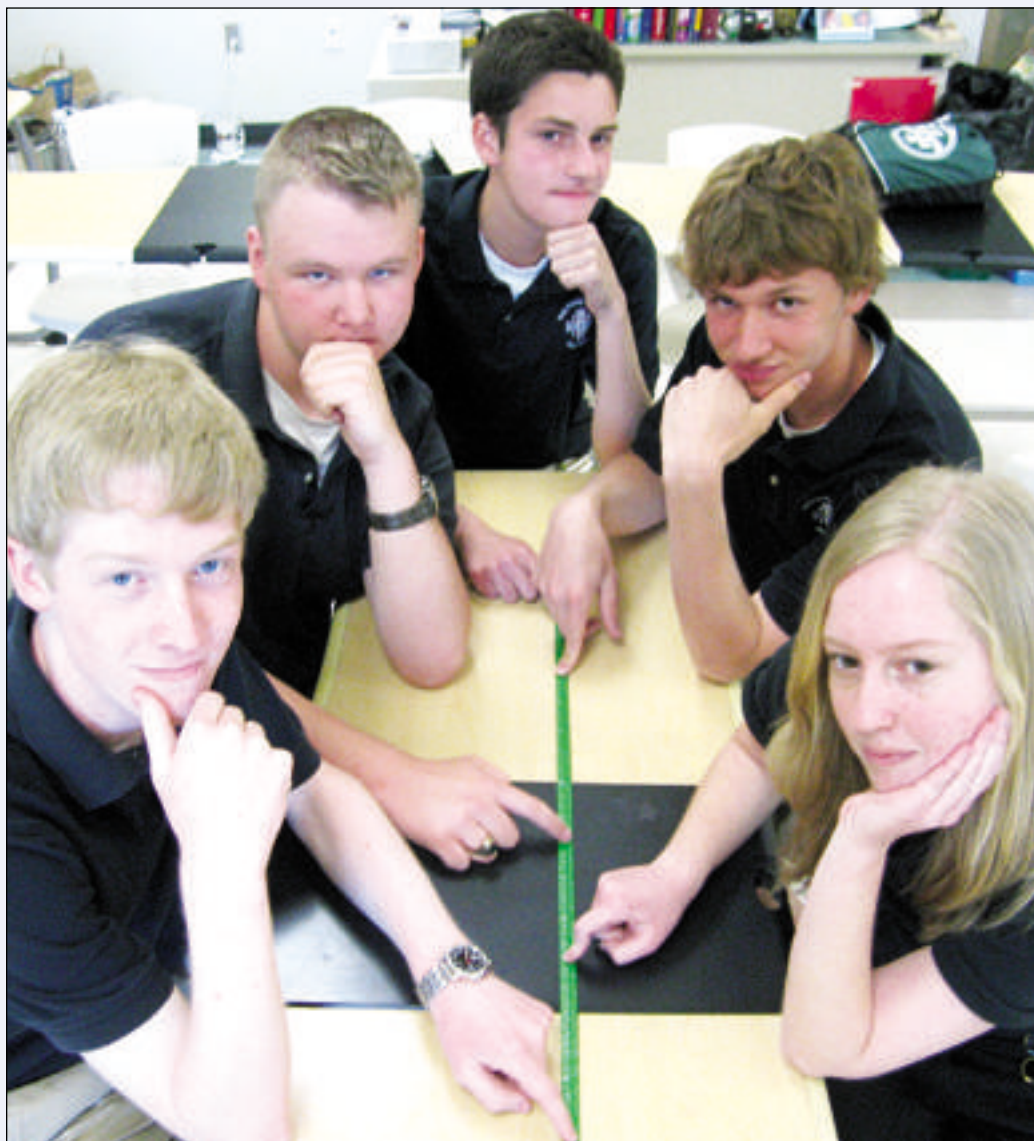

A second liquor store joins downtown retail mix

The good news is that the city is gaining another downtown business. That business is Crossroads Liquor, which plans to open July 1, in the vacant space next to Fresh Seasons Market on Victoria Drive. The grocery store owners hope the liquor store will increase traffic in the downtown and in their store.

The bad news is that the city might not be big enough to support two liquor stores. Deepinder S. Baveja, a Victoria resident, owns HI-5 Liquors at 1512 Commercial Ave. He also owns HI-5 Market, a convenience store and gas station at the same location.

The City Council reviewed Crossroads Liquor's applications for a permit and a liquor

license at its April 26 meeting. The Planning Commission had reviewed the applications earlier in the month and voted to recommend approval 4-1; city staff also recommended approval. It was a tough call to make.

Either decision has the potential to inflict hardship on a local business—either the grocery store or the current liquor store.

"The city is not big enough to support one liquor store," Baveja said. "It will not support two."

He asked the City Council to deny the Crossroads Liquor applications for a permit and a liquor license. His convenience store sales dropped by 50 percent, he told the council, when the grocery store opened a year ago. He was afraid a sec-

ond liquor store in town would similarly affect his liquor store sales.

Last July, he purchased the local Subway franchise and brought the sandwich business into his remodeled convenience store.

Dale Riley, co-owner of Fresh Seasons Market, told the council, "We need additional growth. Sales are not what we expected." Riley went on to say that while they've been surprised at the distance some of their customers are coming from, making it a destination store, "We need more Victoria residents," he said.

The City Council had an extensive discussion about the applications, the city's business growth and the accompanying competition that it will continue to bring. Mayor Mary

Hershberger Thun clarified that the city is not subsidizing the new liquor store; the financial assistance the city provided to Victoria City Center, the company that built the building which Fresh Seasons Market leases, was to bring a grocery store to town. While the developer benefits from TIF financing, Fresh Seasons Market pays market rate rent on the space, as will Crossroads Liquor.

"We can't get involved with the business of competition but leveling the playing field," Councilor Tim Amundsem said.

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Tragedy, then growth

Editor's Note: This is the second in a series of columns celebrating the history of St. John's Lutheran Church, in its 125th year.

Tragedy struck on Aug. 23, 1921.

A fire had begun early evening the day before and was put out. Someone from the congregation stood watch until midnight to make sure the fire would not restart. Assured it was definitely not smoldering any longer, he went home.

The fire reignited at about 4 a.m. and was at full blaze. The actual discovery was by a neighbor across the street, who ran to the fire station to sound the alarm (since there were no phones).

By the time the fire department arrived, the building was completely destroyed. The church that housed the congregation of St. John's, having served as a house of worship for 36 years, burned to the ground!

The only items salvaged, because someone ran in and retrieved them, were the statue of Christ and the crucifix, which are on the altar of our present church.

In a well-attended meeting of the congregation, on Aug. 31, 1921, it was unanimously decided to erect a new church.

The new church was designed by Slifer and Abrahamson, St. Paul architects. The church would be built in a Gothic style throughout, of modern fireproof construction, with a reinforced concrete floor and a slate roof.

The walls were of Bedford stone and Oriental Rough texture face brick in variegated

colors built in the Chaska brickyard.

The overall length of the building was 103 feet and 11 inches; width at the side entrances 72 feet; and height of the steeple, about 92 feet. There were four entrances and a full basement. The capacity was to be about 600.

On April 24, 1922 the first bricks were laid, and on July 2, 1922, the cornerstone was laid in a special service in which the Rev. M.F. Abraham preached in German, and Pastor F.L. Oberschulte preached in English.

Pastor Schmidt performed the laying of the cornerstone. The dedication of the new church took place on July 8, 1923. Three services were held simultaneously; one in the sanctuary, officiated by Rev. K. Schmidt; one in the church basement led by Rev. Paul Koenke; and one outside officiated by Rev. W. Ernst. Also, there was an afternoon service both in the church, the basement of the church and outside, all officiated by different pastors. Further, there was an evening service as well-preached in English.

A mass choir, under the direction of Prof. H.F. Ehlen, rendered many beautiful selections. The women of the church served an estimated 2,000 people a meal. The whole church cost came to about \$89,000, excluding local labor and many materials. A debt of about \$13,000 remained at the time of the dedication.

In 1922, Pastor Schmidt began to do mission work in the "State Reformatory for Women" at Shakopee. The Record Book of the church states "From 1922

the pastor in conjunction with the Ladies' Aid, carried on mission work in the Reformatory at Shakopee, Minn. The pastor was privileged to preach there every other Sunday afternoon and to conduct Bible Classes every Tuesday evening."

This work, which Pastor Schmidt began and then continued until 1927, was being

carried on by Pastor Otto Kohn, until his retirement in 1964. After Pastor Kohn retired, the pastor at Trinity in Carver assumed these responsibilities.

Vikings stadium proposal introduced in St. Paul

Legislators cool to idea

The drive to build a new multi-purpose stadium for the Minnesota Vikings is in the Legislature, and for once this off-season Brett Favre may not be the biggest question mark on the minds of Vikings fans.

What's at stake now is a home for the team and many think the future of professional football in Minnesota.

"I watched the North Stars leave," said Cory Merrifield, a Shakopee resident who helped begin a grassroots effort (www.savethevikies.org) in January to raise support and awareness about the perceived need for a new Vikings stadium. "I don't want to see the Vikings leave. If we can lose the North Stars, we can lose the Vikings."

Many Minnesota sports fans remember in 1993 when the North Stars left for Dallas. They fear the owners of the Vikings franchise will move their team to Los Angeles if a deal resulting in the construction of a new stadium isn't in place after the team's Metrodome lease expires in 2011.

A bi-partisan group of lawmakers in support of legislative action to help finance construction of a stadium unveiled a plan to pay for it on Monday. The plan would fund a \$791 million fixed-roof stadium. It would commit the Vikings to \$264 million up-front construction costs and would then expect to collect the remaining \$527 million over 40 years.

The proposal would have called for an area hotel tax, a jersey purchase tax, a sports-themed scratch off ticket, and a tax on metro-area rental cars. However, after Gov. Pawlenty announced on Tuesday he would accept no tax increases in a stadium bill, the House Local Government Division approved an amended bill shortly after midnight on Tuesday that no longer contained the trio of tax increases. The sports-themed lottery game was kept.

Supporters of the bill insisted no state money for schools,

roads, health care, or any other state programs will be used to build the stadium.

"We will not pass a bill that adds a nickel to the deficit, or takes a dime from nursing homes, schools, roads or hospitals," said Rep. Loren Solberg, a Democrat from Grand Rapids, the chief author of the bill in the House of Representatives. In addition to Solberg's authorship in the House, Rep. Morrie Lanning, a Moorhead Republican, co-authored the bill. The chief author in the Senate is Sen. Tom Bakk, a Democrat from Cook.

The amended bill calls for the Metropolitan Council to issue revenue bonds backed by an upfront team contribution, and then use a portion of Minneapolis hospitality tax revenues now used to pay off debt for the Minneapolis Convention Center once that debt is retired in 2020.

Chilly reception

Although the proposal was unveiled at a crowded news conference, it does not have widespread support in the Legislature.

Late Monday evening, Sen. Julianne Ortman, a Chanhassen Republican, said she would review the bill on its merits. She said it appeared to her "to be a back-room deal drawn up by a small group of legislators and representatives from the Vikings."

Sen. Claire Robling, a Jordan Republican, said she opposes the hospitality surcharge.

Asked last week about the potential of a Vikings stadium deal, Rep. Joe Hoppe, a Chaska Republican, said fixing the state's \$1 billion budget shortfall this biennium was a greater concern.

"We need to get that done, or there will not be a new Vikings stadium. We need to get our priorities done first," said Hoppe. Rep. Paul Kohls, a Victoria Republican, agreed.

"First things first," Kohls

said. "I don't think we should be spending our time talking about a stadium until we get our budget deficit resolved."

Despite Hoppe's insistence the budget gap must be met first, he said informal meetings between legislators, the Vikings, interested business communities, and others have been ongoing for the past year. In recent weeks the discussions have been more noticeable, if not more formal. Vikings team owner Zygi Wilf reportedly met privately with unnamed legislators, and one evening Vikings Pro Bowl Defensive End Jared Allen paid a friendly visit to a group of legislators for photos and autographs.

Funding

The new stadium proposal relies heavily on user fees, whereby only those who benefit from the stadium would pay for it. Hoppe referred to it as a "user-based model."

"The idea is that those who use the stadium pay for the stadium," he said.

Hoppe said only a proposal that would not raise general taxes or divert money from the state's general fund could have a chance of success this legislative session.

According to Robling, many legislators representing Scott County are pushing for a state Racino proposal, which they claim could provide money for a stadium with the addition of slot machines to Canterbury Park in Shakopee.

A Racino "is the only form of funding I can think of that'd raise enough money right now," said Robling.

Other legislators have come up with their own ideas. Earlier this year, Kohls proposed selling the Metrodome to the team for \$1.

Ortman suggested public financing may be available for a stadium "if the Vikings agree to pay back the cost of that financing."

Eden Prairie, home of the Minnesota Vikings main office, has legislators with decidedly skeptical views on taxpayer funding for stadiums.

"I hear a lot from constituents on the Viking stadium and, honestly, on both sides," said Jenifer Loon, a Republican.

Loon said she'll look at every proposal "with an open mind," as long as that proposal is not trying to take general fund tax dollars or create a new tax on everyone to pay for that stadium, she added.

When it comes to this year's particular proposal, however, "there just isn't a lot of time," said Loon.

Maria Ruud, a Democrat from Minnetonka, does not support taxpayer funding for a Viking stadium.

"The budget itself is a big enough problem for us to deal with this year," said Ruud.

To take on the Vikings stadium at this point wouldn't be prudent, she added.

For their part, the Vikings were reportedly not thrilled with the proposal made on Monday because it would force the team to pay for a retractable roof. Instead the Vikings have committed to paying \$210 million, which would be roughly one third of the cost of a roofless stadium.

History

The Vikings have called two stadiums "home" in their 49-year history: Metropolitan Stadium in Bloomington and the Hubert H. Humphrey Metrodome in Minneapolis. On Sept. 10, 1961, the Vikings played their first-ever home game, a 21-17 preseason loss to the L.A. Rams at Metropolitan Stadium. The Vikings moved indoors in 1982 to the Metrodome in downtown Minneapolis.

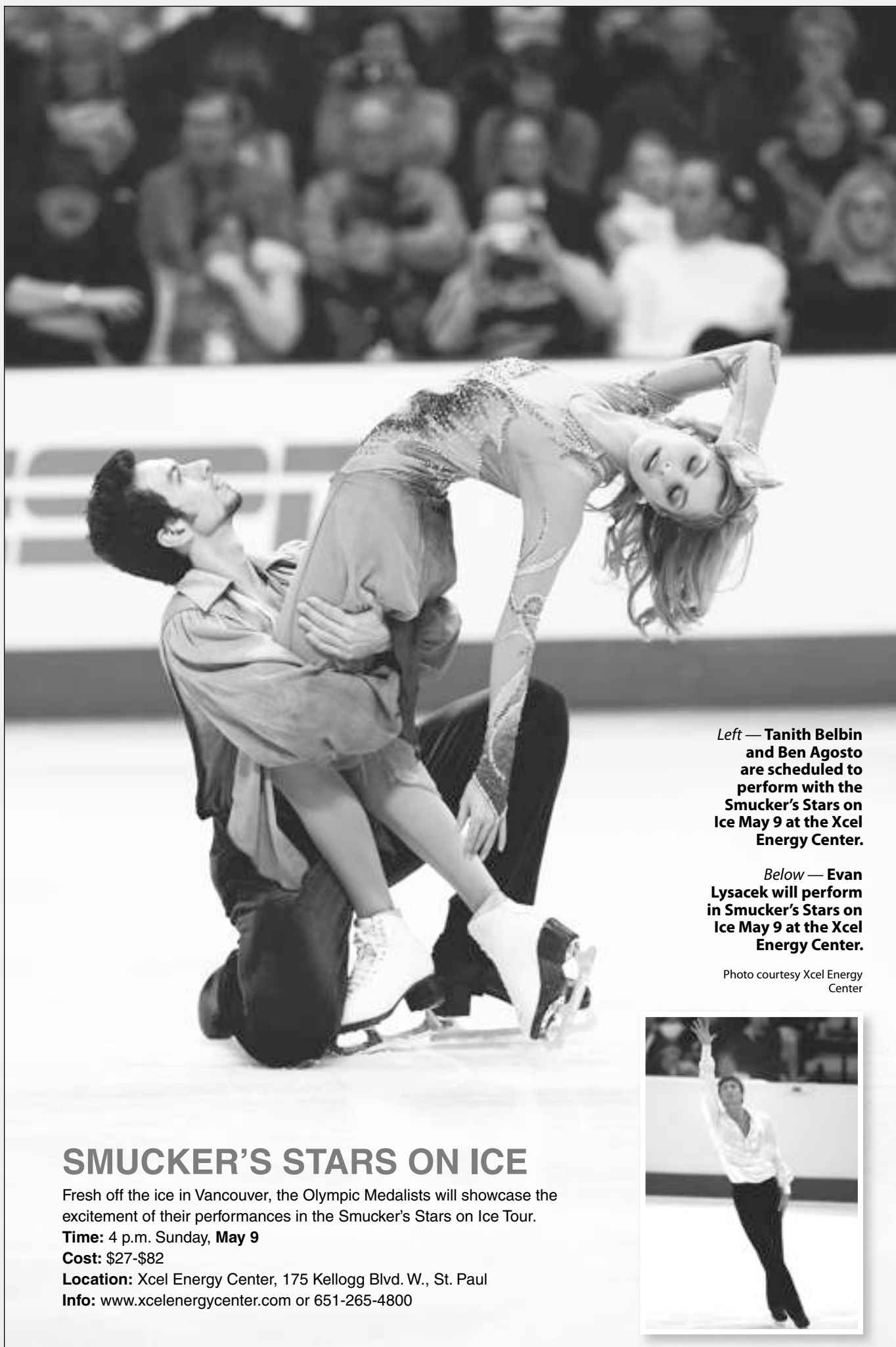

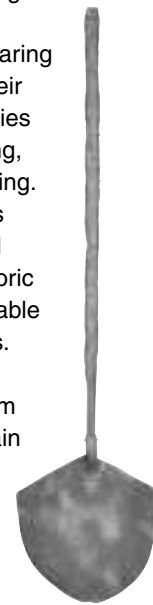

“It started with the earthquake in Haiti,” said their mom Brenda Patterson. “Alexis saw that some local girls were selling items for Haiti at a Chaska thrift store. She wanted to do something, too. I said, ‘There are a lot of children here in our community who need help, too.’ That night we went to rehearsal and we thought about the theme of the show — Joseph feeding the starving people in Egypt — and it just clicked. ‘Let’s raise money for our local food bank,’ we said.”

They presented the idea to the cast who wholeheartedly dove in. Alexis and Collin got assistance making the bracelets from the cast of children. “It turned out that a lot of the adults from the cast bought them,” Brenda pointed out, “because we strung them in order of the colors in the song, and they used them as a memory prompt!”

The newspaper asked Brenda some questions about CVFT.

Q: Is this the first time your family has been in a CVFT show?

A: We were looking for a family activity, one that would allow us a fun common experience, would have us all running in the same direction (for a change), and challenge us in a new way.

Car rides became a sanctuary to review the 29 colors in the song about Joseph’s coat; later a place to blast the Megamix song.

We talked about rehearsals ... music needed to be perfected, dances required precision. We were being beautifully stretched as individuals, and yet brought closer as a family. Truly, the process of preparing the show was as much a treasure as each performance.

Q: What other hobbies and interests do Collin and Alexis enjoy?

A: Collin and Alexis both study at home, yet are not at home a lot since they join with other students to learn in cooperative classes around the metro area.

Chaska's Bagley keeps on dancing

Miss Dance/Drill Team Minnesota won the overall points category and title in 2009 and for the first time in the pageant's forty-one-year history, but they wanted to prove that it wasn't a fluke.

Over Spring Break at the University of California-Irvine, MDT Minnesota served notice to the high school dance world by repeating both major titles at the Miss Dance/Drill Team USA 2010.

Both in 2009 and 2010, Chaska High School varsity dancer Jillian Bagley was a member of MDT Minnesota.

A senior from Chanhassen, Bagley was determined to return to Miss Dance/Drill Team USA (MDT USA) this year after taking first last year with her Chaska teammates in trio competition at Nationals. She qualified by placing in last fall's MDT Minnesota.

The competition requires that participants be members of a state high school dance team. Bagley was a captain of Chaska's 2009-10 varsity dance team that was sixth in high kick and fifth in jazz at the Minnesota State High School Dance Meet.

After Bagley made the solo team last fall, the MDT Minnesota's director, Jenny Raiche, combined the different age group medalists into the Minnesota Dance/Drill Squad.

"At Nationals, there were a lot of contestants from all over the country," Bagley said. "I did my solo to a cover of 'Chasing Pavements' by Airtro and finished eleventh in the Miss Dance/Drill Team Competition."

Overall, 10 competitors in individual competition from Minnesota placed within their divisions, and they scored two first places.

"Nine of the dancers that made up Minnesota's Dance/Drill Squad were from our high school Sections at Wayzata," noted Bagley, pointing out the tough competition that Chaska faces in route to the State Meet every year.

Though the Hawks will make the switch from the Lake Conference to the Missota Conference next year, the Chaska dance team will be in the same historic 2A section.

"Utah, California, and Minnesota were the strongest by far, both in the individual and team dance," said Bagley.

Bagley helped the Dance/Drill Squad Minnesota defeat all comers. Paige Horwood from Maple Grove was crowned Miss Dance/Drill Team USA, and received an all-expense paid trip to Japan for a dance event there.

At the end of MDT USA, MDT Minnesota had again amassed the most total points of any team, and Minnesota high school dancers had let the USA know there's a new dynasty in town.

Big steps

Bagley will keep on dancing, as she was accepted to the University of St. Thomas and recently landed a spot on the dance team.

St. Thomas won the open division for college nationals at UDA three out of the last five years. The Tommies were first in jazz and second in hip-hop at nationals last year.

Bagley will dance with the

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Author discusses mysteries of Emerald Isle

Erin Hart

Author Erin Hart gives a talk at the Chanhassen Library at 1 p.m., Saturday, May 8, with Irish music by Paddy O'Brien.

Erin will be speaking about her trips to Ireland to research her books, and her husband, Paddy, will be providing some Irish music. Hart is the award-winning author of three mysteries.

I interviewed Hart recently:
Q: Who were your favorite authors as a child?

A: The very first books I really remember loving were a Hilary Knight "ABC" book, and a storybook called "The Tall Book of Make-Believe," by Jane Werner and Garth Williams. I can still see all the wonderful illustrations in my mind's eye.

The first chapter book I remember being a true favorite was "Half Magic," by Edward Eager, about four siblings who discover a magic coin that only gives them half of what they wish for - because somehow that premise seemed so much more realistic than a genie who could grant whole wishes.

I also had a great love of fairy tales and folktales and mythology from an early age. I remember being fascinated by the bad behavior of Greek and Roman gods and goddesses, and by all the strange and wonderful creatures Odysseus encountered on his long voyage home from war.

Q: Do you have any stories from your childhood involving a library?

A: I remember spending a LOT of time in the library in Rochester, my hometown. At that time, the library was a wonderful old limestone building downtown (now the Mayo Medical School's Mitchell Stu-

dent Center).

I remember pulling open the front door of the building, being so excited to be entering a place that smelled so strongly of books. It was the smell of adventure to me - there's no other scent quite like it. The children's collection was downstairs. I remember walking along walls lined with books, feeling giddy at the prospect of getting to read them all - and I think I actually did.

Q: You have had a lot of interesting jobs, working in arts administration, writing as a journalist and theatre critic. If you could not make a living as a writer, what would your dream job be?

A: My first dream was to become a theater director, and that notion still appeals to me. I also really loved working as a theater critic and journalist; I got to experience so many great productions, and interview so many interesting, creative people - from stars of stage and screen to local artists. I really miss that.

Q: What do you think inspired your love of Ireland?

A: I don't know that there's any rational explanation. I've thought about this a lot, and all I can say is that there was something about the music, about the shape of Irish melodies that drew me in from the time I was a young child.

I learned all the Irish songs in the book of folksongs that always sat on our piano. I remember that my grandparents

sent us a postcard - not from Ireland, but from the Great Smoky Mountains in Tennessee - of a stream flowing over mossy rocks.

I remember looking at that picture, thinking: "That's what Ireland looks like. And that's where I'm going to go." It's strange - I'm the only person in my family with this fascination for Ireland. Maybe it's because I was named Erin (after my one Irish-American grandmother), I don't know.

Q: You have written three books now, featuring Irish archeologist Cormac Maguire and American pathologist Nora Gavin. Your first book, "Haunted Ground," was nominated for an Anthony Award and an Agatha Award for best first novel. You did extensive research for Lake of Sorrows, involving the history of peat production, beekeeping, archeology, bog workers and Celtic gold. The newest book, "False Mermaid," is set in both Ireland and Minnesota, when Nora returns home to try and catch her sister's murderer. Will there be more in the series?

A: No. 4 is in the works right now. Nora and Cormac are back in the Irish bogs, involved in recovering what looks like a ninth-century manuscript - and possibly the remains of a ninth-century monk. A medieval manuscript turned up in a bog in Tipperary just a couple of years ago, so that's my jumping-off point. The real manuscript was a Book of Psalms, now referred to as the Faddan More Psalter. It went into the bog open with Psalm 83 clearly visible. So you see, I don't actually have to make anything up, except maybe the part about the monk.

Q: Tell us how you met your husband, and about his music. He will be performing when you speak at the Chanhassen Library, can you

give us details on the music and the instruments he'll be playing?

A: Paddy and I met at MacCafferty's Bar in Saint Paul in 1981. I'd already developed a strong interest in Irish music, and had been traveling in Ireland, attending an Irish language course in Galway, and on the day I arrived home, all my dancing friends insisted that I come down to MacCafferty's to hear the great band called Bowhand.

Halfway through the evening, I heard a voice announcing: "Now we'll have a song from Erin Hart." It was Paddy - someone must have told him that if he announced me, I'd get up and sing. And I did - so that's how we met.

Paddy plays the two-row button accordion. He's been playing Irish traditional music since he was about 12, so that's over 50 years. His real love is the old-style dance music of Ireland - jigs, reels, hornpipes, polkas, plus slow airs and a few other sorts of tunes, most handed down from one generation to the next. Some of the tunes are hundreds of years old.

What's so fascinating about Paddy is that he doesn't read music, so he keeps his whole store of tunes (at least 3,500 at last count) in his head. I'd call him a walking encyclopedia of Irish music, but he's very modest about his vast repertoire - doesn't even call himself a collector, but an 'accumulator' of tunes. He usually plays some tunes as part of my reading, and talks a little about the music, its history, and where it comes from."

Favorite Reads

An enthusiastic crowd listened to Carver County guest presenters talk about their favorite books on April 29, at the Chanhassen Library, and enjoyed treats donated by Fresh Seasons Market in Victoria.

District 100 Superintendent Nancy Rajanen shared her

passion for the books of Tracy Kidder, "Flight," by Sherman Alexie, and "Animal, Vegetable, Mineral," by Barbara Kingsolver.

Ridgeview CEO Robert Stevens talked about "Three Weeks with my Brother," by Nicholas Sparks. He described how Sparks grew up in rural Wattertown, living in a remote farmhouse that was reputedly haunted!

By the time Nicholas and his brother were in their late 30s, all the other members of their family had died and the two brothers travelled together for three weeks.

Other guest presenters included Mark Olson, editor of the Chaska Herald; Chaska Police Chief Scott Knight; and Library Director Melissa Brechon.

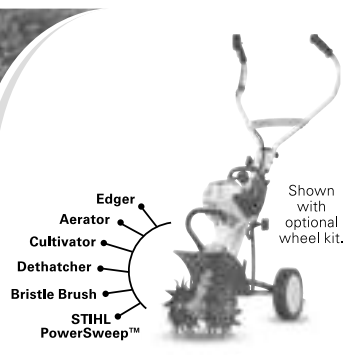


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
